- Data processing should be performed at local intersections to improve reliability. This also helps to improve communications latency.
- Once get the data, it's only effective if you can communicate it.
- Most of the interfacing with a person outside of the vehicle today, is with smart phones.
- We need to be inclusive of all stakeholder groups and all different kind of systems.
- We need to have people get services and understand best use.
- Issues with funding and priorities at the local level. <u>CAV isn't happening now</u>, so the focus is on the needs of today.
- Not everyone has access to technology used to broadcast messages in a work zone.
- Local agencies are partial to their own equipment. Need to be open to new ideas and solutions.
 We need leadership on potential for inter-jurisdictional partnerships.
- The education piece is a must. Users need to better understand the technology available to them today.
